#### Check eligibility and apply

You can check your eligibility on our website by answering a few simple questions. You can then apply online or request a paper application form.

#### Confidential support

Our grants team can support you throughout the process, in confidence, whether by phone, email or post. If you have a question, get in touch.

### Grants are available in times of need and include:

**Emergency grants** for unexpected expenses, such as replacing a broken appliance, fixing a car, school-related expenses or heating costs.

**Wellbeing grants** to support your work/life balance with grants towards fitness and leisure, holidays, respite breaks and sabbaticals.

**Health grants** could support counselling, occupational therapy assessments, mobility aids, adaptations or other therapies.

**Financial support grants** (means-tested\*) to help in a time of financial hardship, whether for a specific need such as furniture, or for general living expenses.

**Debt support** if you are worrying about your level of personal unsecured debt. Our partner organisations may be able to help. Serving clergy may also qualify for grant support.

**Ordinand health grants** are available (as above) for ordinands or members of their family living with a physical or mental health condition.

**Clergy Support Trust library.** Ordinands and curates-in-training (IME2) can access over 1,100 ebooks from SPCK/IVP for free via apps and a website.
